#### We are Mathematicians

Y6 have been focussing on shapes, space and measure. They can now identify and measure angles, understand the different features of polygons and polyhedrons (2d and 3d shapes). Y1, Y2 and EYFS have been experimenting with art techniques. Looking at different natural art mediums. Investigating Abstract artists such as Wassily Kandinsky and copying his style of painting with Primary colours. Y6 are creating a collaborative piece of work with the theme "Environment" using recycled items.

#### We are Scientists


Y3 have been learning all about the structure of the Earth including how volcanoes & geezers are formed, dinosaurs and their fossils. Y4 have been investigating light & sound. How sound is made and detected, what is sound pitch and vibration. They also looked at what is light and how does your eye detect light?

The children met Bristol Mayor, Marvin Rees and were able to discuss the CLF curriculum from their perspective.
