New Nature Garden

Miss Strachan has successfully been awarded a science grant from our friends at Hanson Box Project.

The Academy will be match funding and after listening to our pupil Eco Warriors, our aim is to increase the biodiversity in our school grounds.

We will be installing interconnected ponds to support our work on insects, habitats and the environment. In addition we will be installing a composting bay so that each class can recycle their food waste and the resulting fertiliser can be used to support the development of our allotment.

Please don't worry about safety around the ponds. They will be behind a fence that is only accessible with the support of a teacher and they will be raised off the ground (rather than sunken).



Barnardo's launches 'Boloh'



An urgently needed helpline supporting vulnerable Black, Asian and minority ethnic children and families, who have been hardest hit by the COVID-19 crisis, has been launched by Barnardo's.

The first of its kind in the UK, the helpline, named 'Boloh', will provide therapeutic support, a live webchat facility, and will offer a lifeline to communities struggling to deal with issues such as sickness and bereavement and rising hate crime due to the pandemic, on top of entrenched existing inequalities, including poverty, financial hardship and health problems. Boloh is a word used in many languages including Hindi, Urdu and Gujarati, meaning 'speak' or to be invited to speak.

Barnardo's new Boloh helpline will provide advice, signposting and support from trained specialist advisors and therapists - who are from a diverse set of cultural backgrounds and able to speak a range of languages.
