Is your child in Year 6?

You MUST apply for a secondary school place

The deadline for applying is 31 October 2022

- It is important to know that missing this deadline means your child is less likely to be offered a place at your chosen schools.
- You will be asked to list the schools in order of your preference
- \* Choose 3 schools. Choosing less schools, does not mean you are more likely to get your No1 choice.

### Is your child aged 3 or just turned 4?

You must apply for a primary school place a year before  $\underline{\text{your child can}}$   $\underline{\text{start school}}$ .

Applications are now open and close on 15 January.

You'll need to apply then even if you want your child to start part-way through the year.

We also aimed to reduce plastic waste for which we wrote a letter to parents, presented an assembly, and created promotional posters to display in and around the school.

Your pupils involvement in recording meeting minutes will engender in them a sense of responsibility for and ownership of their goals.

This is important as it helps to achieve progress and empower your Eco-Committee. Your curriculum links are diverse, imaginative and topical. We loved reading how students were tasked with writing a story from the perspective of a rainforest animal. This a great example of using the curriculum to engender compassion for our wildlife and its habitats.

We commend your stellar efforts in embedding environmental topics into a broad range of curriculum subjects and your proposal to further embed these into your PSHE curriculum going forward next year.

We love your Eco-Committees organised and systematic approach to communicating their Eco-Schools activity school-wide through the delivery of dedicated assemblies, class feedback, writing letters to parents and other stakeholders and your Eco Warriors Board. This is really strong informing and involving and shows how valued and embedded the Eco-Schools programme is in your school.

We think your acrostic Eco-Code is great. It's wonderful to read how it was a collaborative piece of work that all Eco-Committee members had the opportunity to contribute to. This inclusivity will ensure that they feel a strong sense of solidarity and responsibility for upholding its pledges.

We are so impressed by your achievements this year. We have no doubt that the way your time, effort and dedication has not only supported your students in their personal development but also empowered them to carry their great Eco-Schools work over into their homes and communities must be an immense source of pride for you all at Frome Vale.
