### Lunch Price Increase

School Meal Price Increase for Year Groups 3 to 6

You will be aware that Cabot Learning Federation have not increased meal costs since 2018. However, after careful consideration and discussions with our school meals supplier, Aspens, we are writing to inform you that from Monday 31 October 2022, the cost of a school meal will increase from £2.30 to £2.40.

The process for booking and paying for meals will remain unchanged. Please continue to pay for school lunches in advance by using <u>Pay360</u>

If your circumstances have changed, you may be eligible to apply for Free School Meals. You can check your eligibility by clicking **HERE** 

Universal Infant Free School Meals will continue for all children in Reception class, Year 1 and Year 2.

## Food Allergies

This year we have several children in the school who suffer from various food allergies to Eggs, nuts, kiwi, dairy and gluten.

Severe allergies can be life threatening and we respectfully request that you assist us with ensuring a severe reaction to these foods can be avoided.

- Please could you therefore avoid bringing any food into the classroom (except in your child's lunchbox). Birthday treats MUST be in original packaging (no home made)

- Please encourage your child to wash their hands before and after eating or handling food.

### Pre-Loved School Uniform


We do expect our children to wear uniform every day.



### What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

With the mix of different types of school from Church schools. Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community schools the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. Contact the school directly for further details on open days.
