

FVA Penguin Pounds

Frome Vale Academy

Our pupils can earn Penguin Pounds by carrying out jobs they can apply for, including first aid monitors, lunch trolley monitors, play buddies and recyclers. Initially they need to earn Frome Vale citizen cards for good behaviours and carrying out their jobs. When they have 10 Frome Vale citizen cards, they can convert them to one Penguin Pound.

They can spend their pounds on goods in a prize box from the Principal's office that include toys, rubbers, funky pencils and Frome Vale citizen pens, plus they can buy cakes or sweets when they are on sale. If they save up their pounds, ten can be exchanged for a Frome Vale hoodie.



All this might sound like great fun but there is a serious side to this initiative. It's all about becoming a Frome Vale citizen, holding down a job, earning a salary and realising if you don't work you don't get paid. It also supports pupils to take responsibility for their money.

We hope this will make them better citizens when they enter the wider world, by teaching them life skills that will stay with them and to prepare them for what lies ahead.




