- Children will be able to borrow both fiction and non-fiction books to read for pleasure at home, if they wish.


We are Athletes

We are Writers

We are going to begin this term with a wonderful children's book called 'Beegu'; written by Alexis Deacon. The book introduces us to 'Beegu,' a beguiling character with three eyes and long, floppy ears. Beegu is not supposed to be on Earth. She is lost. She a friendly little creature, but the Earth People don't seem very welcoming at all. However, so far, she has only met the BIG ones. The little ones are a different matter.



We will be using this book, to develop our speaking and listening skills, building our writing by engaging in our every time we write features, which are:

- Capital letters
- Full stops
- Finger spaces
- Presentation / Handwriting / Letter formation

Children will have the opportunity to explore descriptive language, the use of conjunctions and to build their awareness of sentence structure.

This term, we will imitate the story of 'Beegu', showcasing our knowledge and understanding of this story.

We are Mathematicians

As Mathematicians in term 1, we will be starting with 'numbers to 10.' This unit will allow us to use concrete materials, along with pictorial representation to count to 10, find one more and one less of a given number, compare groups using the correct mathematical language and order numbers.

Across our learning, we will be exploring fluency, reasoning and problem solving through our giving it a go, got it and flying.


Our giving it a go will allow children to know key mathematical facts, recalling them quickly and accurately. Our got it activities will allow opportunities for logical thinking to derive the correct problem-solving strategy. And finally, our flying learning will promote children's thinking to find a way to apply their knowledge and skills to answer unfamiliar types of problems.

Towards the end of this term, we will be learning about 'shape'. This will focus on recognising and naming both 2D and 3D shapes, along with creating patterns.

We are Mathmagicians

Our mathmagicians sessions are designed to be a highly visual number fact teaching programmes, which supports children to develop a deep understanding of number and number relationships, and fluency in addition and subtraction facts.

The first unit within our mathmagicians sessions will support children in developing their ability to subitise numbers to 10, before we learn to make and break numbers to 5, and then 10.



During this term, we will visit our school display boards, explore 'Pantosaurus' and sign our computing acceptable use policy.




We are Scientists

Our topic this term in science will be 'seasonal change.' We will be learning about the four seasons being able to describe some weather features, know the importance of the sun for light and warmth, and to have an awareness of thermometers and their purpose.
