Welcome to Term 5 of Year 5!


As we have now started the summer term, there is not long of Year 5 left before the children move on to Year 6!

Reading:		Homework:	
We do half an hour of reading Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday where the children read their levelled books or choose from a range of free reader books. Every Friday, there is book club, where the children are able to read to each other, and share a book of their choice from school or home. The children are able to read 1:1 with an adult every week (for some free readers that will be every fortnight). <b>How you can help:</b> <u>Please ensure that your children are reading at home. <ul> <li>twice a week, preferably four times per week. It would be great if they could read to an adult who can then check their understanding by asking questions. But if this is not possible can you please still check that they are reading for at least 15 minutes two times and week and sign their reading record book to confirm.</li> <li>They need to bring their reading book and reading record to school every day.</li> </ul>		Their homework will usually consist of spellings, which need to be practised and written into sentences. There may be maths related to what we have been	

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studying that week or topic related homework.
