LITERACY	MATHEMATICS	WIDER CURRICULUM
The Term we are studying 'The Rabbits' by John Marsden and Shaun Tann. The story is an allegory for imperialism and the children will be learning about complicated themes such as colonialism, conflict, power, loss and reconciliation.	This term we are looking mostly at geometry, properties of shape, area and angles. We will look at case studies of different industries such as farming and plastics. We will look at the extent of damage and possible solutions to some of the environmental concerns, such as recycling

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In the book, the rabbits invade a peaceful land and the inhabitants become wary and frightened as their lives are gradually taken over. Minimal text and magnificent fullpage illustrations speak volumes about the fear, confusion and suffering of a race which is persecuted and eventually destroyed. This disturbing and thoughtprovoking allegory is ideal for promoting discussion.

The children will write a dialogue to go with the final image of the book, they will also write a narrative which will be a sequel to the story. The children will also engage with statistics, data, bar models, pie charts and graphs.



Every Friday, is Reasoning Friday and the children are involved in reasoning and problem-solving tasks related to their unit of study.



We do half an hour of reading Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday where the children read their levelled books or choose from a range of free reader books.
