Usual information

This term, PE is on Monday morning and Thursday afternoons. On Monday's the children should come to school on Mondays and Thursdays in their PE kits. All of our PE sessions this term are indoors in the hall and the focus is gymnastics and apparatus therefore it is preferable if they are bare foot.

We still have a lot of unclaimed clothes being left in the classroom, please make sure that children's clothes are labelled with their names so that we can return lost or misplaced items.

Levelled reading books (Level18 plus) can be changed by the children on the day they read to me in class. The children are also supported to change their reading books on Friday.

This term my PPA is on a Monday and will be covered by Miss Reed, the afternoon will consist of Reading, Computing and Frome Vale Assembly.

Reading:

All children need to bring their reading book and reading record in to school <u>every day</u>. They will read daily in school and normally once a week to a school adult (sometimes more if we can find the time to squeeze it in or they are on a priority reading list).

It is the school's expectation that children read at least twice every week at home. We recommend 10 minutes every day to really give children the best opportunities to develop their confidence in reading.

Love of Learning:




We will continue with our weekly Jigsaw sessions. This term we are learning about Dreams and Goals.
